Ms Georgina Phua is the Deputy Principal (Development) at Singapore Polytechnic (SP), where she champions the institution's mission to be a Polytechnic for all ages. A key focus of her leadership is driving sustainability across industries through strategic partnerships and innovative solutions. She collaborates extensively with industry partners and government agencies to achieve this vision. Ms Phua's responsibilities encompass overseeing the Departments of Industry & Partnerships and Technology, Innovation & Enterprise, as well as the Professional and Adult Continuing Education (PACE) Academy. These three integrated units comprise 12 consultancy and technology innovation centres, providing a comprehensive suite of resources to support enterprises in their company, workforce, and – crucially – sustainability transformation.

Under Ms Phua's guidance, SP has forged over 40 agreements with industry partners to develop targeted programmes and solutions for local enterprises, with an increasing emphasis on sustainable practices. She has successfully elevated five technology centres to Enterprise Singapore-funded Centres of Innovation (COIs), accelerating the development of innovative and sustainable products and services. One COI specialises in advanced materials for the built environment, directly addressing the need for greener construction solutions. Demonstrating her commitment to this sector, Ms Phua led SP's collaboration with the Singapore Green Building Council (SGBC), City Developments Limited, and Danfoss to co-author a white paper promoting public-private partnerships to advance the adoption of green building solutions in Singapore.

Ms Phua's career at SP began in 1990 as an IT lecturer. In 2010, she was appointed Director of the IT School and subsequently held various Senior Director portfolios. Throughout her career, she played pivotal strategic leadership roles in shaping the institution's direction, nurturing high-performing management teams and mentoring high-potential talents.

Beyond her core responsibilities, Ms Phua is Chair of the Singapore Polytechnic International Board and Live Well Collaborative-Singapore. She is also a Board Member of the Arts House Limited (AHL, a Company Limited by Guarantee under the National Arts Council) and chairs AHL's Human Resources subcommittee. In 2017, she was awarded the Public Administration Medal (Silver) in recognition of her significant contributions to the public sector.
